

Dr. Philip Furmanski is Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey. He oversees undergraduate and graduate education, research, university budgeting, land grant programs, libraries, enrollment management, financial aid, student affairs, institutional research, continuing education, and schools, faculties, centers, and institutes on the New Brunswick/Piscataway campus.

Dr. Furmanski came to Rutgers in 2003 from New York University (NYU), where since 1990 he had been chair of the department of biology, and a professor of pathology at New York University School of Medicine. He also served at NYU as interim Dean of the College of Arts and Science and then Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Science.

His career began at Albert Einstein Medical Center and he has held research positions at Temple University School of Medicine, Dartmouth Medical School, Michigan Cancer Foundation and AMC Cancer Research Center. He is a past member of the University of Colorado Cancer Center, the Rita J. and Stanley H. Kaplan Cancer Center and the Center for AIDS Research, both at NYU Medical Center. Dr. Furmanski has taught at the Dartmouth Medical School, Wayne State University School of Medicine, and the University of Colorado School of Medicine. He is also the author or coauthor of numerous scholarly articles, books, book chapters, reviews, and abstracts.

Dr. Furmanski holds a bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry and a doctoral degree in microbiology from Temple University. He is a tenured professor in the department of cell biology and neuroscience in the Faculty of Arts and Sciences-New Brunswick, and a professor in the department of molecular genetics, microbiology and immunology at the Robert Wood Johnson Medical School of the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey.
